Our Helpline is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week in English and Spanish, and reports can be made anonymously or by name. The School of Dental Medicine ensures the confidentiality of the information in the report and the individual making the report. The School of Dental Medicine endorses employees to report to their supervisor or management instances where they believe violations of policies or standards have occurred.

The School of Dental Medicine encourages employees, vendors, patients, and business partners to report to the Office of Health Sciences Schools Compliance or the Compliance Helpline any actual or suspected violations of the School of Dental Medicine's policies and procedures or federal or state law. Calls received by the Compliance Helpline are often inquiries but can sometimes be reports of potential misconduct. Our investigatory process includes many methods to determine whether any misconduct occurred.

The Office of Health Sciences Schools Compliance takes all calls seriously. Inquiries are reviewed by the Office of Health Sciences Schools Compliance. Other applicable departments may also review them, including but not limited to Human Resources, HIPAA Privacy Office, and University Counsel.
